Nominate A National Master Guardian for the Star Achievement Award!

Receiving the CGC's National Master Guardian certification demonstrates the guardian's knowledge of advanced guardianship concepts and ethics and being on the cutting edge of guardianship issues.

CGC seeks nominations for its annual National Master Guardian *Star Achievement Award*, which will be presented at the National Guardianship Association's Annual Conference.

Nominating Criteria

1. Any NGA member may nominate a National Master Guardian, but no self-nominations will be permitted.
2. The nominee must be a National Master Guardian.
3. The nominee must be a member of NGA.
4. The nominee should have some affiliation with his/her state association.

The CGC National Master Guardian Star Achievement Award Committee will review all nominations. Each nomination must be submitted in writing and include the following:

1. The nominee's name, organization/firm, address, telephone number and email address.
2. Specific examples demonstrating the nominee's leadership within the guardianship community. (Weighted at 40%)
3. Specific examples on how the nominee exemplifies the NGA Standards of Practice and Model Code of Ethics. (Weighted at 40%)
4. A description of how the nominee contributes to the larger community. (Weighted at 20%)

Nominations must be received NO LATER THAN August 1.
